RSC Tree & Roadway Project

The City is moving ahead to remove & replace trees from Avenida Pico to Avenida La Pata, as invasive tree roots have caused safety hazards along the roadway. Dead and diseased trees along Vista Montana will also be replaced. Mariposa Landscape Inc. (NTE \$364,815.95) will remove up to 416 trees, and United Pacific Services will plant replacement trees (NTE \$179,000) for a total NTE \$543,815.95. The city will also repair and slurry Calle Del Cerro.

RSCCA Treasurer Marjie Butterworth and Board President Vonne Barnes met with the City to request a tree pallet of perennials in order to provide year-round color as well as absorption of greenhouse gases from the atmosphere. They also requested low maintenance, drought tolerant trees, to be planted with adequate spacing in accordance with Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA) mandates. President Barnes also asked the City to remove dead trees along the Ridgeline Trail above Harbor View Estates.

The City opted to replace trees along the Del Cerro median with the following: Phoenix Dactylifera (Date Palm), Koelreuteria Paniculata (Golden Rain Tree, [deciduous]), and Magnolia Grandiflora (Little Gem). The project, scheduled to begin sometime in late September, should open up the ocean views for many of our residents, increase road safety, and boost property values. Please drive carefully while the project is underway.

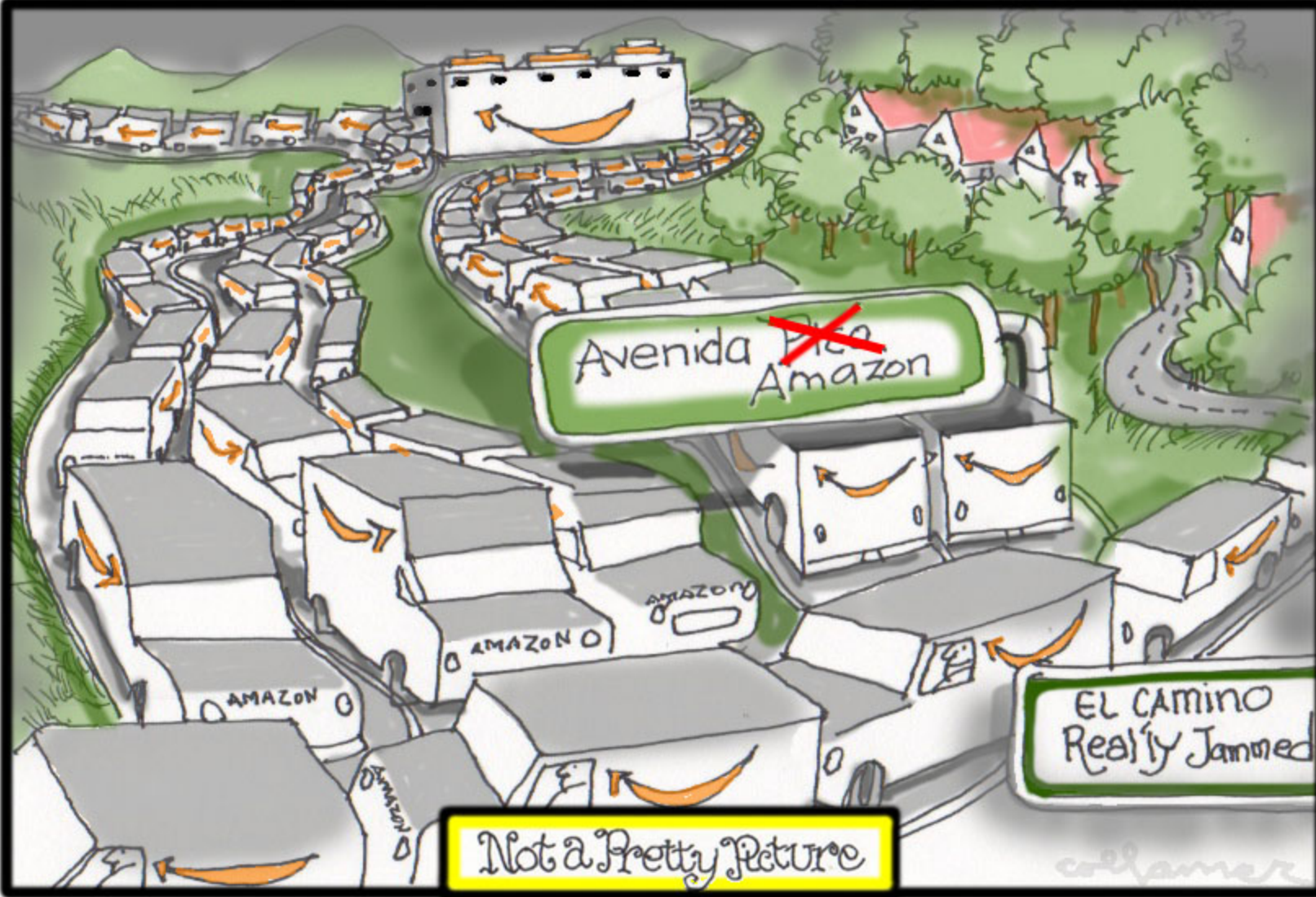
